Shall we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live? ¹⁰For they disciplined us for a short time as it seemed best to them, but he disciplines us for our good, that we may share his holiness. ¹¹For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

¹²Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, ¹³and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed. ¹⁴Strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord.

NICENE CREED

(Please stand)

Celebrant: Let us confess our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

(Please kneel. We invite your prayers, silently or aloud, after each petition.)

Reader: Trusting that our good God wants to hear and answer our prayers, let us turn to him in prayer.

We pray for peace in the world, and for the well-being and unity of God's people everywhere.

Lord, in your mercy:

People: **Hear our prayer.**

Reader: We pray for Foley, our Bishop and Archbishop; for Frank, our assisting Bishop; for Michael, our Dean; for our assisting Cathedral clergy; that you will continually empower them with your Spirit for ministry.

Today in our Diocesan Cycle of Prayer, we pray for the people and clergy of Grace Anglican Fellowship, Olive Branch, Mississippi, asking you Lord to work mightily in that congregation for the upbuilding of your people and the salvation of many.

Reader: We pray for our nation, for those in authority and for all in public service, especially our president Joe, our governor Brian, our senators Raphael and Jon, our representative Carolyn, and our mayor Skip.

Lord, in your mercy:

People: **Hear our prayer.**

Reader: We pray for this congregation gathered today. Speak to us; fill us with your Holy Spirit; empower us for mission; convict us of sin; and mold us more and more into the likeness of Jesus.
Lord, in your mercy:

People: **Hear our prayer.**

Reader: We pray for all those who are facing sickness or need this day, especially those we now name.

Lord in your mercy:

People: **Hear our prayer.**

Reader: We praise you for all who have died trusting in you. Bring us with them to the final day of resurrection.

Lord in your mercy:

People: **Hear our prayer.**

Celebrant: Heavenly Father, hear our prayers, and in your great mercy answer them as may be best for us, to the honor and glory of your Son Jesus, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

People: **Amen.**

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Celebrant: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who in his great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who sincerely repent and with true faith turn to him, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: **Amen.**

THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

(Please kneel)

Celebrant:

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son Jesus Christ into the world for our salvation. By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the Cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved. By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet. As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace.

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body, which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant and people together:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy Sacrament, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

To Receive Communion

*Place one hand on top of the other to receive bread. To receive a gluten-free wafer, place one hand on your shoulder and open your other hand. After receiving the bread you can carefully dip it into the chalice. *If you are unable to go to the rail and need communion brought to you, please alert an usher.*

To Receive a Blessing

If for any reason you wish not to receive Communion, or if you have not been baptized, you are welcome to receive a blessing. Simply cross your hands over your chest at the communion rail to receive a blessing in place of the communion elements.


